INTRODUCTION

Noxious weeds are a major threat to wildlife habitat, biodiversity, and agricultural production in the western states. The ability of non-native plants to invade diverse ecological sites; their rapid spread on range, woodland, and pasture sites; and continuing advances in management techniques makes it important for land managers to understand and use the most current weed management options available.

The Noxious Weed Management Short course was developed for public and private land managers that want to gain a better understanding of noxious weed management. The course supports and teaches ecologically sound management practices for invasive plants.

Weed management professionals from throughout the West will conduct the training program designed to encourage interaction between instructors and participants. Lab and field exercises, in addition to classroom sessions, will be used as teaching methods. Past course participants have been enthusiastic about the format.
