Mark your calendars and make your reservations! The Tamarisk Coalition and CSU Extension are hosting the 2007 Tamarisk Symposium at the Two Rivers Convention Center, in the heart of downtown Grand Junction. In addition, we are planning a fieldtrip to a beetle release site on



the 26th. **Revegetation is the focus of this year's Symposium.** This conference, held every two years, is considered the preeminent conference on the tamarisk problem and will bring together nearly 300 people from throughout the West that include key researchers, on-the-ground program managers, environmental interests, and federal/ Tribal/ state/local interests to better understand the nature of the tamarisk problem, and develop and implement long-term solutions.

Session topics range from revegetation, research summaries from the 2006 Tamarisk Research Conference, restoration projects, the role of NRCS and its partners, a special session on Russian olive, an update on legislation, funding, and policy, and more! The Symposium's focus is on implementation and is a sister conference to the 2006 Tamarisk Research Conference. Funding Opportunities

We have just completed a review of over 1,000 environmental funding sources and have summarized 178 grants that might be appropriate for addressing tamarisk issues and riparian restoration. The tables can be found through the link below:

The tables are divided into Non-profit Foundations, Corporate, and Other Funding Sources; Federal Grants; and Congress Chartered Foundations. State directed funding sources will be added at a later date.

This list of grant opportunities is to be used as a starting point for your grant funding research. This list is not exhaustive and is designed only to provide an overview of available grants.

The tables include organization name, website, geography (to indicate the physical locations the grantor emphasizes), award range, median grant, grants/year, and the categories funded by the grantor which include: Advocacy, Direct Action, Education, Policy, Research, and Start Up.
