



Directions:

Heading East from Asheville-Statesville – head east on I-40, then continue East on Business 40 into downtown Winston-Salem. Take the Cherry St. Exit (5-C) onto High Street. The front entrance of the hotel is immediately on your right. Heading West from Raleigh-Greensboro – take I-40 west, then Business 40 split (Exit 206) into downtown Winston-Salem. Take the Cherry Street Exit (5-C) onto

Cherry Street. Turn left at the first traffic light onto 1st Street. Turn left at the next traffic light onto Marshall St. Cross over Business 40 and through the next traffic light. As you head downhill, the hotel's rear parking entrance will be on your right. Turn into the parking lot and drive around the building to the hotel's front entrance.

Taxonomy and Ecology of Algae By Dr. Linda Ehrlich and Dr. JoAnn Burkholder June 2, 2009 8:00 AM - 5:00 PM Hawthorne Inn & Conference Center Winston-Salem, NC

This workshop will provide information on how to recognize algae in their various surface water habitats, understand why they may become nuisances, and select appropriate means of control in the source water. Fee includes an outstanding workshop notebook for further reference. This workshop is an excellent opportunity for all participants to get hands-on experience with the species that may be troubling their waters.

The workshop course will be lead by two excellent experts in algae in North Carolina. Dr. Linda Ehrlich has studied water resources and freshwater phycology in North Carolina for nearly 30 years. She earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Biology from Meredith College in 1973, a Master of Science degree in Phycology and Water Resources from North Carolina State University in 1979, and a doctorate in Phycology and Toxicology from NCSU in 1987. This is the second algae workshop that she has held in conjunction with NCLMS. Dr. JoAnn Burkholder holds the title of Professor and Director, Center for Applied Aquatic Ecology, North Carolina State University, Raleigh, North Carolina. Dr. Burkholder earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Zoology and Chemistry from Iowa State University in 1975, a Master of Science degree in Aquatic Botany from the University of Rhode Island in 1981, and a doctorate in Botanical Limnology from Michigan State University in 1986. Since 2000, she has held the position of Professor of Aquatic Ecology in the Department of Plant Biology at NCSU. Her research interests include: eutrophication of freshwater and estuarine ecosystems, the biology, ecology, and impacts of harmful algae, and the physiological ecology of seagrasses and other submersed aquatic plants. She has won numerous professional and academic awards.

The workshop will cover common algae species in North Carolina, where they are found and how to identify them. It will cover all algae species of concern to water utility managers dealing with water treatment issues. It will also provide lake and pond managers with the ability to identify algae species for control purposes. The afternoon session will involve demonstrations of state-of-the-art microscopy techniques and microscopes supplied by JP Optical Consulting, Inc., Chapel Hill, NC ipoptical@nc.rr.com.

The workshop is approved by the NC Water Treatment Facility Operators Board for CEUs (pending) and for NALMS Lake Managers.
