- Complete a 15 week assistantship learning horticulture, ethnobotany, and outreach at the Flagstaff Arboretum.
- Complete a Wilderness First Aid course and Seeds of Success Training in Boise, ID
- Assist the NNHP botanist with rare plant monitoring, seed collection, plant identification, and herbarium curation.
