Positions are based in Capitan, Chama, Cimarron, Las Vegas, and Bernalillo and require frequent field work and working extended hours.
10115043, 10115046	Project and Urban Forester (Forester A) to conduct and implement multiple forestry programs including urban and community forestry, advise local government and other cooperators on best forestry practices, develop partnerships, manage cost-share programs, and supervise projects. Positions are based in Las Vegas and Socorro and require frequent field work and working extended hours.
5329	Fire Management Officer (Forester O) with responsibility for fire suppression and initial attack response on state and private jurisdiction, developing agreements with local cooperating agencies, coordinating training and providing for firefighter safety, and facilitating community wildfire protection planning on the Cimarron District.

5318	Assistant State Botanist (Program Coordinator I) to administer the Endangered Species Act Section 6 federal grant agreements and projects with federal and state agencies; including research project development, field work, data analysis and report writing.
10115073	Field Botanist and Invasive Species Specialist (Forester A) conduct field research and surveys on New Mexico's rare and endangered plant species; and manage the invasive plant mitigation program and sub-award grants to landowners.
5328	Cimarron District Forester (A/O-II) to provide leadership in forest management and private land stewardship, guidance for fire suppression and management, ensure firefighter safety, develop plans and budgets, facilitate landscape scale restoration, build relationships with local government, and supervise staff at the Cimarron District.
